



WATER-USE GUIDELINES

- You may run water to fill a swimming pool **ONLY ON THE DAYS AND HOURS ALLOWED** for your address.
- Cars, trucks, and boats may be washed on any day, but **ONLY WHEN USING A QUICK-ACTING, POSITIVE SHUT-OFF NOZZLE ON THE HOSE OR BY USING A BUCKET AND SPONGE**. Commercial car-washes are not restricted in the days and hours they operate.
- **NO WATER USE WILL BE ALLOWED** on any day, at any time, for washing off sidewalks, driveways, patios, parking lots, or other exterior non-landscaped areas without a permit obtained from the Public Works Department.
- No water will be allowed to flow into a gutter or other drainage area for longer than 5 minutes.
- All leaks, breaks, or malfunctions in the user's plumbing system **MUST BE REPAIRED WITHIN 24 HOURS** of discovery or notification.
- No irrigating during and within 48 hours following measurable rainfall (at a minimum, any amount of rainfall that generates run-off or puddles.)
- Water will only be served to restaurant customers upon request.
- First-time violation of the Manteca Watering Schedule or any of these guidelines results in a written notice. Second violation will result in a \$100 fine plus applicable fees (fine may be waived upon attending a Water Conservation Seminar). Third violation will result in a \$200 fine plus applicable fees. Any subsequent violations will result in a \$500 fine plus applicable fees.

LAWN-TO-GARDEN TURF REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

Pays \$1.00 per square foot when a grass lawn is replaced with beautiful, water-efficient landscape suited for our region's semi-arid climate.

TOILET REBATE PROGRAM

Pays \$75.00 for old toilets replaced with dual-flush and high-efficiency (1.28 gallons per flush) toilets.

HIGH-EFFICIENCY CLOTHES WASHER REBATE PROGRAM

Pays \$100.00 for old washers replaced with high-efficiency washers with a water factor of 7.1 or less.

DROUGHT-TOLERANT LANDSCAPING

You may hear a lot of different terms when looking into landscape-related water conservation, like xeriscaping, drought-tolerant, water-wise, low water use, and water-efficient. The bottom line is, you need to choose plants that are appropriate to our climate zone and pay attention to when and how you water.




MANTECA YOUTH ADVISORY COMMISSION



SPORTS FIELD AND OPEN-SPACE USE PERMITS

Need a place to hold a tournament, team practice, or league games?
Contact our office for information on reserving sports fields, ballfields, and park open spaces.

Insurance is required for all sports-field rentals.

Use of park open space is considered first-come, first-served, except when a Park Use Permit has been taken out. A Park Use Permit and appropriate insurance is **required** for the following:

- Groups or organized activities involving 50 or more people.
- Any activity involving the erection or placement of stages, booths, platforms, structures or other art works, or other similar structures (i.e., bounce houses) on park property.
- Commercial or mobile recreation equipment, commercial or non-profit vendors, and other items, including portable restrooms. These uses will require prior approval of the department, additional permits, and payment of associated fees.

Although it is not required, groups of less than 50 people may request a Park Use Permit if they would like to reserve **a specific area** of a park for their exclusive use. The fee for a Park/Open Space Use Permit is \$10.00, in addition to insurance and any other permit fees that may apply. Come into our office to complete an application.

REGISTRATION DEADLINES / LATE FEES

- Registration deadlines are given for the activities and programs listed in this guide. These deadlines are necessary to allow adequate time for the instructor to anticipate the number of participants and plan accordingly.
- A late registration fee of \$5.00 per class or activity will apply for any registration received after the deadline. If there is not a specific deadline given, the default deadline is 5:00 pm on the business day prior to the start of the program.
- Register early! Some classes fill quickly, and others may be canceled due to low enrollment. Registration received after the specified deadlines will be subject to a \$5.00 late fee.
- Registrations received prior to the above dates will not be given priority consideration.
- Some classes have special registration notes, such as priority registration for current students. Please take note of these comments in individual class descriptions.

SPECIAL NEEDS

Individuals with disabilities are encouraged to register and participate in our programs. In order to facilitate your involvement, special needs will be reasonably accommodated on an individual basis upon request.

Please contact our office at 456-8600 at least two weeks prior to the start of the activity if you will need special accommodations. Our staff members want to hear from you if they can help.



PAYMENT OF FEES

- Registration fees may be paid by cash, check (payable to City of Manteca), Visa, MasterCard, Discover, or American Express.
- Fees must be paid in full at the time of registration.
- Non-Resident fees apply to any participant residing outside the Manteca city limits. Address verification may be required in the form of a City of Manteca water bill.
- To avoid complications due to filled classes, you may wish to send separate checks for each activity.

* REFUND POLICY *

Please make your selections carefully. NO REFUNDS will be given after the first class meeting. Failure to attend a program is not grounds for a refund. If you are not satisfied with a program you have attended, please contact the program supervisor or our office.

Refunds will be granted only if requested in writing. A "Request for Refund" form must be completed and received in our office (via fax, walk-in, or mail) at least 24 hours prior to the first class meeting. Please allow four weeks for processing. **Refunds and credits** will be subject to a \$10 processing fee per class.

CREDIT: In lieu of a refund, you may request to have a credit to your account, which may be used only for future program participation.

A full refund will be given if the class or activity is cancelled by the City or the instructor.

FINANCIAL AID SCHOLARSHIPS

Manteca Parks and Recreation has a scholarship program to help youth (ages 18 and younger) from low- to very-low-income households participate in recreation programs and activities offered by the Department.

Eligible youths may receive discounted registration, depending upon availability of funding. The scholarship covers a percentage of the activity registration fee; the participant must pay the remainder. Proof of family income is required. Please contact the Department for an application or additional information.




