### PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

#### Community Events

- Tickets are now on sale at the Senior Center for the 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Teen-Adult-Senior Prom. Enjoy a formal evening of dancing and music. Tickets are only \$10 per person in advance or \$15 at the door and include sweets, treats, beverages, and a souvenir photo. The event will take place Friday, June 9, from 6:00 to 9:00 p.m. at the Manteca Senior Center, 295 Cherry Lane.
- Tickets are on sale now for the Senior Center's next Friday Night Bingo for ages 18 and older. The event takes place at the Senior Center, 295 Cherry Lane, on July 7 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Doors open at 4:00 p.m. Each \$10 ticket includes event entry and one six-pack of bingo cards; additional bingo packs are available at the event for \$5 each. There is limited space available, so buy your tickets early!

#### Senior Services

- The Manteca Senior Center, 295 Cherry Lane, is open to seniors ages 50 and older Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. There is no membership fee! Come enjoy the many daily free and fee-based programs, such as photography classes, chair volleyball, various exercise classes including tai chi and yoga, and much more! First-time visitors receive an informational tour of the Center and everything it has to offer. Call 456-8650 for more information.
- The Senior Center's next monthly Potluck Dinner will be held Thursday, June 15, at 5:00 p.m. Seniors ages 50-plus are asked to bring a dish (enough to feed eight people), plus your own plates and utensils. Brookdale-Manteca will be providing the dessert. For more information, call the Senior Center at (209) 456-8650.
- Tickets for the June 19 Spaghetti Dinner and Bingo Night are on sale now. Each \$8 ticket includes entry, spaghetti, salad, garlic bread, beverages, and dessert. Doors open at 4:00 p.m. and bingo is played after the dinner; bingo six-packs are available for \$5 each. You must be at least 50 years old to attend this event, and you must purchase a dinner ticket to play bingo. For more information, call the Senior Center.

#### Recreation Programs

- *Public Swim*—Lincoln Pool, 245 S. Powers Ave., is now open for the summer season! Come cool off during public swim hours Monday through Friday from 1:00 to 4:30 p.m., Friday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m., and Saturday and Sunday from 12:00 to 6:00 p.m. Pool admission fees are \$2 for youth ages 4-17 and seniors ages 62 and older, and \$3 for adults ages 18-61; children under 4 years old are admitted free. A Family Swim Pass for a full season of public swim at Lincoln Pool

may be purchased at the Parks and Recreation office, 252 Magnolia Ave., for \$60. The pass is limited to four people at a time, with a maximum of two adults per admission.

- *Swim Lessons*—Group and private swim lessons began June 5. Registration for the next session, beginning June 20, is now open through Parks and Recreation, (209) 456-8600. Swim lessons fill up quickly; sign up before it's too late.
- *Junior Lifeguard Clinic*—The Guard Start Junior Lifeguard Clinic will be held next weekend, June 17-18, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Lincoln Pool. Participants will learn water safety and practice real lifesaving techniques used by actual lifeguards. This is certain to be a fast-paced, fun-filled weekend. Registration is \$30 for Manteca residents and \$40 for non-residents, and the program is for participants ages 10-14. Registration is through the Parks and Recreation office.
- *Tiny Tots*—Tiny Tots T-Ball for ages 3-6 began June 3 at Stella Brockman School. The program runs for five weeks and there are more than 100 participants enrolled.
- *Basketball Camp*—Basketball Camp for ages 7-15 will be held Monday through Friday, June 12-16, at Golden West Community Gym. There are more than 55 participants enrolled, and the camp will be held again July 10-14.
- *Youth Baseball*—Youth Baseball League for ages 9-14 begins June 13 at Northgate Softball Complex. The program runs on Tuesday and Thursdays for seven weeks. Sign-ups are still being accepted through the Parks and Recreation office; the fee is \$47 for Manteca residents and \$57 for non-residents.

### **Kids' Zone Programs**

Kids' Zone, a California state licensed child-care program, operates at nine Manteca Unified School District elementary schools, with 22 total programs. Before-school, KinderZone, and After-School care are available at select schools. Kids' Zone is currently closed for the summer break. The parent handbook and application materials for the 2017-18 school year will be available in July on the Parks and Recreation website, or in the office at 252 Magnolia Ave.

### **Summer Camp**

The City offers a Summer Day Camp program at Lincoln School for children ages 5-12 Monday through Friday, May 30-August 4 (excluding July 4), from 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Each themed week is packed with arts and crafts, group games, swimming, outdoor play, a field trip, and special events! This week's theme was "Return of the Jedi" and camp featured games like "Pin the Lightsaber on Yoda" and crafts including Galaxy Slime and Erupting Death Stars, plus swimming at Lincoln Pool, outdoor games, and a field trip to Zaps Zone for laser tag.

### **Little People's Creative Play and Mom/Dad & Me**

The City offers a structured learning program Mondays through Thursdays for preschool-aged children, 3½ to 5 years old (Creative Play), and a parent participation class on Friday mornings for toddlers 18 months to 3 years old (Mom/Dad and Me). Creative Play allows children to work on motor skills and socialization, while learning the alphabet, numbers, shapes, colors and songs.

Parents may enroll their child for one day a week, or a combination of days. There are daily craft projects, snacks, sharing and story time. Mom/Dad and Me is a stepping-stone to Creative Play and requires parent participation.

## PUBLIC WORKS

### **WQCF Recycled Water:**

Construction season is upon us and with that, Recycled Water use has kicked into high gear. Contractors used 253,140 gallons of recycled water in May 2017 and a total of 5.1 million gallons in 2016. All Manteca construction projects needing water are required to use recycled water as of May 2015. Prior to this, contractors were allowed to use potable water, which is higher quality drinking water. Manteca’s recycled water is high quality Title 22 disinfected tertiary (filtered) treated wastewater, which is approved for many uses in addition to construction (which is the only permitted use at this time). All water truck drivers must take a 30-minute Recycled Water Workshop given at WQCF every other Wednesday at 8:00am. This Workshop goes over the procedure to take water, the hours recycled water is available, recycled water safety and notification, regulatory requirements listed in Title 22 and in our NPDES permit, and what information they need to provide every time they take recycled water. Upon completion of the Workshop the drivers are issued a recycled water certification card which they must show each day they come to take recycled water. ## COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

### **Building Safety Week in Review May 30 – June 2:**

The Building Safety Division conducted a total of 255 inspections during the week. The division issued 64 building permits, which included Addendum, Residential Electrical Service, Commercial Fire Sprinkler, Residential HVAC, Residential Electrical, Residential Plumbing, Patio Cover, Residential Remodel, Single-Family Detached Dwellings, Shed, Commercial Shell Building, Residential Solar, Swimming Pool Solar, Commercial Tenant Infill, Water Heater, and Water Softener. A total of 53 new project applications were accepted and of those, 16 were issued immediately. A total of 37 submittals were held for plan check, which included Addendum, Carport, Commercial Coach, Fire Alarm, Commercial Fire Sprinkler, Landscape, Miscellaneous Commercial Building, Residential Mechanical, Multi-Family Apartments, Patio Cover, Single-Family Detached Dwellings, and Swimming Pool/Spa.

## FIRE DEPARTMENT

### CERT Training

On Saturday, June 3<sup>rd</sup> and Sunday, June 4<sup>th</sup> Manteca CERT (Community Emergency Response Team) members along with French Camp Fire District members participated in a CERT Program Managers Course lead by Wilson Lee from LA County Sheriff's Department and Chad Fitzgerald from Clovis Fire Department. This class was coordinated with help from Manteca Fire Captain Sterrie McLeod who has been instrumental in assisting the Manteca CERT team. The object of the class is to align CERT's goals and objectives with the community's needs.

### Highlights of Incidents

- Fire – East Louise Avenue  
Firefighters responded on mutual aid to the report of a commercial structure fire on East Louise Avenue Sunday evening. Upon arrival, Engine Company 243 was assigned to provide water transfer to Engine 34 but was reassigned to check for extension inside of the structure. Firefighters found some boxes that has burned but were extinguished by the sprinkler system; no other extension could be located. The crew assisted in shutting down the sprinkler system before being released to return to their district.
- Fire – South Austin Road  
Firefighters responded on mutual aid to the report of a trailer fire on South Austin Road early Monday morning. Upon arrival, Engine Company 243 was assigned to give Engine 33 a water transfer and to man a second hose line for fire attack two. Firefighters extinguished the trailer fire and performed overhaul on the exterior of the structure before being released to return to their district.
