PARKS AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

Community Events

- Tickets are on sale now for the Senior Center's next Friday Night Bingo for ages 18 and older. The event takes place at the Senior Center, 295 Cherry Lane, on July 7 from 6:00 to 8:00 p.m. Doors open at 4:00 p.m. Each \$10 ticket includes event entry and one six-pack of bingo cards; additional bingo packs are available at the event for \$5 each. There is limited space available, so buy your tickets early!

Senior Services

- The Manteca Senior Center, 295 Cherry Lane, is open to seniors ages 50 and older Monday through Friday from 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. There is no membership fee! Come enjoy the many daily free and fee-based programs, such as photography classes, chair volleyball, various exercise classes including tai chi and yoga, and much more! First-time visitors receive an informational tour of the Center and everything it has to offer. Call 456-8650 for more information.
- The Senior Center will host the next monthly Potluck Dinner on Thursday, July 21, at 5:00 p.m. Seniors ages 50-plus are asked to bring a dish (enough to feed eight people), plus your own plates and utensils. Recreation Programs

- *Public Swim*—Lincoln Pool, 245 S. Powers Ave., is now open for the summer season! Come cool off during public swim hours Monday through Friday from 1:00 to 4:30 p.m., Friday evenings from 6:30 to 8:30 p.m., and Saturday and Sunday from 12:00 to 6:00 p.m. Pool admission fees are \$2 for youth ages 4-17 and seniors ages 62 and older, and \$3 for adults ages 18-61; children under 4 years old are admitted free. A Family Swim Pass for a full season of public swim at Lincoln Pool may be purchased at the Parks and Recreation office, 252 Magnolia Ave., for \$60. The pass is limited to four people at a time, with a maximum of two adults per admission.
- *Swim Lessons*—Group and private swim lessons began June 5. Registration for the next session, beginning June 20, is now open through Parks and Recreation, (209) 456-8600. Swim lessons fill up quickly; sign up before it's too late.
- *Junior Lifeguard Clinic*—The Guard Start Junior Lifeguard Clinic will be held this weekend, June 17-18, from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at Lincoln Pool. Participants will learn water safety and practice real lifesaving techniques used by actual lifeguards. This is certain to be a fast-paced,

fun-filled weekend. Registration is \$30 for Manteca residents and \$40 for non-residents, and the program is for participants ages 10-14. Registration is through the Parks and Recreation office.

- *Tiny Tots*—Tiny Tots T-Ball for ages 3-6 began June 3 at Stella Brockman School and runs for five weeks. There are more than 100 participants enrolled.

- *Basketball Camp*—Basketball Camp for ages 7-15 began June 12 at Golden West Community Gym. Camp runs through Friday, June 16, and there are more than 55 participants enrolled. Basketball Camp will be offered again the week of July 10-14.

- *Youth Baseball*—Youth Baseball League for ages 9-14 began June 13 at Northgate Softball Complex. The program runs on Tuesday and Thursdays for seven weeks. Sign-ups are still being accepted through the Parks and Recreation office; the fee is \$47 for Manteca residents and \$57 for non-residents.

Kids' Zone Programs

Kids' Zone, a California state licensed child-care program, operates at nine Manteca Unified School District elementary schools, with 22 total programs. Before-school, KinderZone, and After-School care are available at select schools. Kids' Zone is currently closed for the summer break. The parent handbook and application materials for the 2017-18 school year will be available in July on the Parks and Recreation website, or in the office at 252 Magnolia Ave.

Summer Camp

The City offers a Summer Day Camp program at Lincoln School for children ages 5-12 Monday through Friday, May 30-August 4 (excluding July 4), from 6:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Each themed week

is packed with arts and crafts, group games, swimming, outdoor play, a field trip, and special events! This week's theme was "Kid Fest!" and camp featured an epic dance-off and a camper and staff talent show, plus swimming at Lincoln Pool, outdoor games, and a field trip to Pump It Up! Little People's Creative Play and Mom/Dad & Me

The City offers a structured learning program Mondays through Thursdays for preschool-aged children, 3½ to 5 years old (Creative Play), and a parent participation class on Friday mornings for toddlers 18 months to 3 years old (Mom/Dad and Me). Creative Play allows children to work on motor skills and socialization, while learning the alphabet, numbers, shapes, colors and songs. Parents may enroll their child for one day a week, or a combination of days. There are daily craft projects, snacks, sharing and story time. Mom/Dad and Me is a stepping-stone to Creative Play and requires parent participation.

PUBLIC WORKS

Family Entertainment Zone Infrastructure Improvements Project

Underground utilities construction is nearing completion. Both the new sewer and water mains at the Family Entertainment Zone have been installed and are undergoing final testing. Once the testing and punch list items are complete the lines will be put into operation.

The new 48-inch reinforced concrete pipe (RCP) sewer main is lined with T-Lock technology. T-Lock is a PVC liner to protect the RCP from corrosion. The combination of strength from the reinforced concrete with the corrosion protection from the PVC liner should provide a long lasting facility that will serve all of south Manteca for many years. The sewer main has been connected at the Atherton and WQCF tie-in locations. The new 18-inch water main and the tie-in at Daniels have also been installed.

The new sewer and water mains were both installed by micro-tunneling under Highway 120. Micro-tunneling is a trenchless tunneling technology that achieves installation with only two excavations at each end of the alignment. Micro-tunneling uses a remotely controlled boring machine to drill through the soil while a casing pipe is jacked into place behind the boring machine. Micro-tunneling allows the installation of pipes underneath natural and well as man-made obstacles such as highways.

The project is on schedule and anticipated to be completed by September 2017.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DEPARTMENT

Building Safety Week in Review June 5 - 8:

The Building Safety Division conducted a total of 217 inspections during the week. The division issued 45 building permits, which included Residential Addition, Residential Electrical Service, Commercial Fire Sprinkler, Residential HVAC, Miscellaneous Commercial Building, Residential Electrical, Residential Mechanical, Residential Plumbing, Patio Cover, Residential Remodel, Residential Reroof, Single-Family Detached, Residential Solar, Swimming Pool/Spa, Above Ground Tank, Commercial Tenant Infill, and Water Heater. A total of 53 new project applications were accepted and of those, 10 were issued immediately. A total of 43 submittals were held for plan check, which included Addendum, Residential Addition, Commercial Building, Commercial Fire Sprinkler, Residential Fire Sprinkler, Hood & Duct, Landscape, Master Plan, Multi-Family Apartment Units, Patio Cover, Residential Remodel, Swimming Pool Master Plan, and Commercial Tenant Infill.

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Report Illegal Fireworks:

In May 2016, the City Council approved higher fines for the sale, use possession or discharge of illegal fireworks. Now, the fines for illegal firework-related violations are \$750 for the first violation and \$1,000 for each additional violation. To report violations or known habitual offenders please e-mail FIREWORKS@MANTECAFIRE.ORG. The City of Manteca will increase enforcement for illegal fireworks use over the 4th of July holiday weekend.

Firework Stand Training:

The Fire Prevention Division held a mandatory fire prevention class on firework stand safety Wednesday evening. Each of the non-profit organizations are required to attend this training to ensure that their organization complies with the established safety requirements. Each firework stand will also be required to distribute literature on the consequences associated with the use of illegal fireworks. Another meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, June 14.

Highlights of Incidents

- **Vehicle Fire – State Route 99**

Firefighters responded to the report of a vehicle fire on Southbound Highway 99, South of Cottage early Thursday morning. Upon arrival, firefighters found a fully involved vehicle fire on the right shoulder of the highway. Engine Company 244 blocked traffic in the slow lane to provide a safe working area. Firefighters quickly set up for a fire attack and extinguished the fire with approximately 300 gallons of water and foam. There were no injuries reported.

Vehicle Accident

On June 9, Officers and Firefighters responded to Wendy’s, 1630 East Yosemite Avenue, regarding a vehicle that collided with a building. Officers arrived on scene and found a vehicle had collided with the north facing exterior wall of the Wendy’s Restaurant. The damage extended a few feet into the business. The driver and all patrons were not injured as the result of the collision. The driver, who was not impaired, indicated the vehicle was recently purchased and she was unfamiliar with it. She believed a mechanical problem caused her to collide with the building.



Assault with Firearm

On June 10, Officers responded to Quicki Kleen Car Wash, 707 East Yosemite Avenue, regarding a shooting. Upon arrival, officers located a male victim standing near his vehicle. The victim was suffering from a single gunshot to lower half of his body. First aid was provided until medics arrived on scene. The victim advised officers he was shot after leaving the carwash. The victim did not initially provide information regarding the suspects. The victim was ultimately transported to a local hospital for medical treatment. Officers conducted an investigation and were quickly able to identify three suspects. Detectives responded to further assist the investigation. Detectives continued their investigation and arrested three male juveniles for the shooting. All were booked into juvenile hall for attempted murder, assault with a deadly weapon, and conspiracy.
